Paul's Sweet Potato Surprise

- Donuts or other baked goods
- Applesauce
- Canned sweet potatoes
- Dash of nutmeg

Spray the bottom of a casserole dish with Pam. Cut the donuts or baked goods in half and layer them on the bottom of the dish. Completely cover with a thick layer of applesauce.

Place a layer of sweet potatoes (either chunks or mashed) over the top of the dish. Sprinkle with a dash of nutmeg. Bake for 45 minutes at 350 degrees. Serve with whipped cream or vanilla ice cream.

Preparation is often unseen, and yet is the foundation for amazing things later to be seen. Such is true for Simon’s Walk.

Simon’s Walk, part of TACO’s new Going Home program, provides training, mentoring, and supervision for volunteers ministers to people who are homeless and terminally ill. Simon’s Walk volunteers will literally be *walking with* a person through to the end of his or her life.

Much of the “unseen” has been your uplifting prayers and support—bless you!

Our focus has been to gather a solid core of volunteers to be trained into Simon Ministers.

After many conversations and a few interviews, three people will begin training next month.

Paul Moorman, Beth Slevcove, and Jan Bluemer come to us with impressive professional and personal experiences.

Paul, Beth and Jan will begin their training by attending the two-day “Walk With Me” Eleos Training, and then continue with extended Simon’s Walk training through early December.

Paul is well-known to TACO volunteers in his role as food coordinator for the TACO program.

Beth, a member of First Lutheran Church, is a spiritual counselor and faithful volunteer with TACO.

Jan is a member of Calvary Lutheran of Solana Beach, and volunteers with the ministry of Resounding Joy, bringing music to people in need. Previously, Jan has a background in the field of Healthcare Administration.

We ask that you hold Paul, Beth, and Jan up in your prayers during this challenging new stage of their lives.

The name “Simon’s Walk” comes from Simon of Cyrene who, in all four gospel stories, walks with Jesus in the final hours of his life, helping also inspires us to see Jesus in the

faces of the homeless people we intend to serve.

The Going Home project’s part time staff will form a team with patients and seek to relieve their needs for housing, insurance, medical care, spiritual care, companionship, family contact and reunification, end-of-life care, memorial services, and burial needs.
